


Home Learning

Hi everyone, I hope that you all had a super Easter Holiday. I made a quiz for my children to get clues for where I had hidden their Easter eggs. Now it's back to learning....

Our topic for this term would have been 'Once Upon a Time' so each week we are going to choose a Traditional story to base our learning on. This week it's "**The Gingerbread Man**"



If you have a book of The Gingerbread Man then you could share it with a grown up. Try to read some of the words and join in with the repeated phrase 'Run, run as fast as you can....' You can watch a video on You Tube such as <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=YoQyyB5xvLk>. Compare all of the different versions – Do all the stories have the same characters? Do all of the stories start in the same way?

You could then get creative –

- Make masks of the characters
- Act out the story
- Draw a story map
- Make gingerbread men using playdough or actually bake them using a gingerbread recipe and decorate them with Smarties or raisins
- Suggest some adjectives for each character
- Suggest new characters
- Change the ending of the story
- Write your own version of the story, don't forget your story opener such as 'Once Upon a Time' or 'One Saturday afternoon'

- How many ways could you put three buttons on the Gingerbread Man if there were three different colours?
- Set up a shop. How much would one Gingerbread Man cost? Which coins could I use to pay for it? What change would I need if I had a 50p piece? How much would three Gingerbread men cost?
- Draw a Gingerbread friend for the Gingerbread Man
- If you're lucky enough to buy or bake some Gingerbread Men, you could do some science experiments such as seeing what happens if you dunk them in warm milk or cold milk
- Measure using the Gingerbread Men
- Sew some Gingerbread Men and the other characters to make finger puppets

Most of you are on Phase 5a or Phase 5b. If you click on resources and select your phase it takes you to lots of fun games to practise your phonics and reading.


