

Literacy Challenges

This terms topic is traditional fairy stories. Pick a favourite fairy tale. Draw a story map to show the different sequence of events. Practise retelling the story and then rewrite the story in your own words. Remember some of the grammar rules we learnt in year 2. Can you think of interesting sentence openers and different punctuation that you can use?

Remember there are two different ways of spelling the word tale or tail. These words are called homophones they sound the same but have a



different meaning and a different spelling. Can you make a list of other homophones e.g. eye/I, knight/night or two/to/too? How many can you think of?

Other ideas

Whilst you are out taking your daily exercise have a look to see which types of flowers you can see. Can you find out about the different parts of a plant. Draw a labelled diagram of a flower you have seen whilst out walking. Can you find out why plants have roots and flowers have petals?
