


Home Learning Activities

Mrs Maw's Class

Hi children, I hope that you are still enjoying your home learning, it has been nice to catch up with most of you this week during my phone calls home.

This week I have chosen a funny story called the **Shark in the Park!** By Nick Sharratt. You can find this story on YouTube. Encourage the children to join in with the repeating parts of the story. As you read emphasise the rhyming words. He also has other stories like Shark in the Dark you might enjoy!



Make a telescope with the children out of a kitchen roll or rolling some card and taping. Read the story again but change the character name Timothy Pope to your child's name 'George Pope, George Pope is looking through his telescope, he looks at the sky, he looks at the ground, he looks left and right and he looks all around and this is what he sees'. Your child can use their telescope to follow the words.

The children can use their telescopes to go on a number hunt - what numbers can you see? On a phone, a car registration, on a clock for example.

They could go on a shape hunt - what shapes around us can you see? The clock is round like a circle, the window has four sides like a square, a door has two long sides like a rectangle for example.

There are many other hunts you could do - looking for colours, big, little objects, objects on top of something, under something.

There are lots of rhyming words in this story, you could talk about rhyming words, say as many as you can, make some funny alien words up - cat, hat, mat, rat, tat, zat, bat, dat, sat

Sing nursery rhymes or action rhymes together.

Draw a picture of a shark, find out some facts about sharks!
