Home Learning Activities - Maths

Keep practising your times tables. At the end of year 2 you should be able to recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5 and 10 multiplication tables, including recognising odd and even numbers. Ask an adult or an older brother or sister to write out some multiplication questions. How many questions can you answer in a minute? Try to beat your score the next day.

Remember if you know $2 \times 5 = 10$ you also know $5 \times 2 = 10$, $10 \div 2 = 5$ and $10 \div 5 = 2$.
